Anne had owned a beautiful top floor tenement in Glasgow for over 10 years. When she was diagnosed with MS her home gradually became a dangerous prison. It took HOS 2 years to help Anne find her "right home, right place". She never gave up and neither did we.

HOS supported Anne to look at lots of solutions including buying a new home. Unfortunately, the lack of wheelchair housing meant that nothing suitable came on the market. Fortunately for Anne because of her housing need and high-risk status she was offered a fully accessible flat by a West End housing association.

Anne loves her new home and gets active daily on her mobility scooter.
